A Japanese waitress came to their table and asked the major if he wanted A or B dinner. The major replied, "Bring the food." The waitress repeated her question, and the major repeated his answer. The author told the waitress to bring the B dinner, the same as his. Then he turned to the major and said, "Sir, you are easily satisfied. Some people complain about the food, even though they have a choice." With a faraway look in his eyes, he said, "They ought to take them out and shoot them." They ate their meal in silence.

The concept of cause and effect of climate change is generally misunderstood. The initial cause resulted into a chain reaction with each effect in turn becomes cause of another set of effects. Frankly, I willingly surrendered to my Lord, Jesus Christ, since I deeply realized the simple yet splendid truth: Christ is Jesus forever! Thus, this book focused not on my personal story in the cult but upon the glory of the gospel I met, which means that this humble book tells just a little about my real story, uglier than a caterpillar; rather, it tells why I knelt down to the Triune God, and how the Bible changed my whole life.

Mental health problems among asylum seekers and refugees are becoming a public issue, but awareness of this problem among the mental health community is relatively low.

Although advances have been made in the provision of innovative mental health services for asylum seekers and refugees with PTSD, they are not systemized, and not widely known to professionals in the field. A publication offering practical guidelines for the treatment of torture victims and political refugees does not exist. Broken Spirits aims to bring together the works of the most respected mental health professionals - from the U.S. and abroad - and make available the most current knowledge on complex PTSD, forced migration and cultural sensitivity in diagnosis and treatment.

Bookending the chronology of this collection are two crucial moments in the histories of pain, trauma, and their staging in British theater: the establishment of secular and professional theater in London in the 1580s, and the growing dissatisfaction with theatrical modes of public punishment alongside the increasing efficacy of staging extravagant spectacles at the end of the eighteenth century. From the often brutal spectacle of late medieval mystery plays to early Romantic re-evaluations of eighteenth-century

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appropriations of spectacles of pain, the essays take up the significance of these watershed moments in British theater and expand on recent work treating bodies in pain: what and how pain means, how such meaning can be embodied, how such embodiment can be dramatized, and how such dramatizations can be put to use and made meaningful in a variety of contexts. Grouped thematically, the essays interrogate individual plays and important topics in terms of the volume's overriding concerns, among them Tamburlaine and The Maid's Tragedy, revenge tragedy, Joshua Reynolds on public executions, King Lear, Settle's Moroccan plays, spectacles of injury, torture, and suffering, and Joanna Baillie's Plays on the Passions.
