After a period of post-war austerity, in 1957 Alfa Romeo decided it was time to re-enter the market for luxury/executive class cars with a new range designed for the growing

number and prosperity of potential customers. Thus, the first models in the new 2000 series emerged, followed by the 2600 series in 1962. That they were not hugely successful, although some 18,540 were manufactured between 1957 and 1966, can be attributed to a number of factors, principally cost. Largely ignored for many years, these cars are now recognized as a significant element in Alfa Romeo's history and this book is a valuable record of their story. The Giulia range of cars is very complicated. From the earliest curvaceous coupes by Bertone, through the more aggressively styled Zagato SS and the very special TZ models to the final 1750 and 2000 cars with their much squarer styling, the Giulia coupes offer a remarkable variety. Here is a collection of road tests, comparisons, driver's impressions, performance data and technical information. The models covered are: 1600 Sprint GT, 1600 Super, 1600 Sprint GTC, 1600 GTA, Radford Sprint GT, 1600 Sprint GTV, Savage Conversion, 1750 GTV, 1300 GT Junior, 2000 GTV, 1300 GTA Junior.

BMW chassis. This monograph covers this long technical and stylistic history, drawing on a clear, comprehensive text and hundreds of photographs, many of which previously unpublished. The series, includes books on Zagato (2017) Touring (2017), Pininfarina (2018) and, to be published soon, Bertone, Vignale and Ghia.

All of Alfa's great sportscars, including the convertibles and coupes, come vividly to life, from the pre-war 6C to today's Spider and GTV, including the Giulietta 750 and Giulia 101.
