In July 1965, teenagers Sylvia and Jenny Likens were left in the temporary care of Gertrude Baniszewski, a middle-aged single mother and her seven children. The case shocked the entire nation and would later be described as "The single worst crime perpetuated against an individual in Indiana's history".
