In 1939, Kay Jeynes, a lively, ambitious young working-class woman, goes to work for the only Japanese businessman in town, the elderly, wealthy, Oxford-educated Mr. Miyashita. Told through the eyes of an older Kay, and set during the turbulent and racially charged times of the Second World War, *Flying Time* is a triumphant story of love and adventure, the impetuosity of youth and the regrets of age.
