These diary entries from John and Elizabeth Bennett cover the few months before Gurdjieff's death in Paris on October 29, 1949. Widely regarded as Sorrentino's finest achievement, Mulligan Stew takes as its subject the comic possibilities of the modern literary imagination. Sorrentino has vastly extended the possibilities of what a novel can be in this extraordinary work, which both parodies and pays homage to the art of fiction.
