Since the first edition was published in 1992, Nick Robinson's *The Planting Design Handbook* has been widely used as a definitive text on landscape architecture courses throughout the world. It is generously illustrated, including a colour section and the beautifully detailed line drawings of the Chinese architect and painter Jia-Hua Wu.
