These essays explore today's trends of fabricating new, original artefacts with Woolf's work, which thus remains completely relevant to our contemporary needs and beliefs.

Capri, c'est fini ! Information Age: Paradigm Shift in the Filmmaking Stefan University Press
As chairman of the European Association of Nuclear Medicine (EANM) 2001 annual meeting, I tried to reach two goals: a "universal nuclear medicine" congress where all people could speak and learn using the same language, and a full exploration of the possibility of making a diagnosis through global imaging. I am personally convinced that nuclear medicine techniques in the detection of infection and inflammation are essential, and in the near future their role and clinical impact will be impressive. As stated during the meeting, this topic will be one of the major and expanding fields of interest for nuclear medicine. During the post-congress meetings organized in Capri by Alberto Signore and Mauro Liberatore for each topic, there was a leading expert for the clinical, radiological and nuclear medicine aspects. This interaction was crucial for the quality of the discussion and the definition of flow charts that will be useful for all the medical community. These meetings, where for each topic there is full coverage of all the aspects of imaging, are, in my opinion, the most fruitful and useful for the progression and

diffusion of nuclear medicine procedures. May 2002 Prof. Marco Salvatore Chairman of the EANM Congress 2001 Some 35 years ago, a French singer sold millions of records with a song, trying to tell the world "Capri c'est fini" - Capri is over.

As journalists, both had covered the Vietnam War until 1972. After twenty long years-of Stalinism, boat people, Hollywood heroics and French nostalgia - they decided it was time to go back. Vietnam, they believed, was not a story which "you could simply stop watching and switch off." They traveled from South to North, from Ho Chi Minh City (Saigon) to Hanoi, exploring memories of the war and the contradictions of peace, looking and listening with a sensitivity and sense of solidarity all too rare in travel writing. The result is an extraordinary account of a country transformed and of a people, victors and victims together, betrayed on all sides, coming back to life. In Hanoi they find none of the grim austerity imagined by foreigners, but rather a city of beauty now 'opening' to capitalism partly thanks to the experiences and money orders of workers sent in their thousands to Poland of the GDR. At Khe Sanh, on the bloodiest battlefield of the war, children dig for shrapnel to sell for a cent a kilo; lovers stroll on the beach at De Nang, where the first US troops landed. Loudspeakers in the street still broadcast a litany of production figures, but they are drowned out by Paul Anka and the Everly Brothers. Saigon, the author discovers, has easily triumphed over Stalin's murderous economic planning. But it may face a tougher adversary in capitalism, whose grim 'post-communist' program can be found in a single neon sign: "Kenwood-HiFi-Stereo-Night-Club-Karaoke-VIP-Room-Discotheque-Saigon-Pub-Health-Centre-Coffee-Shop." As rich in political perceptions as it is in memorable images, *Return to Vietnam* shatters the myths about a country which the West fought over, flattened and forgot.

Every musical form has had an impact on the linguistic practices of our society. French song is a vector of cultural, social, and stylistic values. Throughout the world, songs in the French language are used in the teaching of French: professors incorporate songs into the curriculum in order to illustrate differences of register and linguistic variation, as well as to raise lexical or grammatical questions. As a form of popular expression, song is a genre that has, in recent years, become the focus of serious academic scholarship and criticism. However, few linguists have paid attention to French song and its linguistic uses. This richly illustrated mini-dictionary about French singers fills this gap by offering a collection of portraits of the greatest singers of the French language and how they have constructed the musical landscape in both France and the larger francophone community and the world as a whole. Through (re)discovering these classic and contemporary artists who contribute to the creation of the sonorous universe of the 20th and 21st centuries, the volume determines how these musical genres influence the French language and nourish our collective imagination. By plunging into francophone song, one can achieve a better understanding of the culture and the language of its speakers.

Grounded in a deep intimacy with Capri and full of captivating anecdotes, Jamie James's *Pagan Light* tells how a tiny island served as a wildly permissive haven for people—queer, criminal, sick, marginalized, and simply crazy—who had nowhere else to go.

Après-guerre, Marguerite Duras vit avec son ancien mari Robert Antelme et son

compagnon Dionys Mascolo, le père de son fils Jean. Le trio accueille, rue St Benoît, des amis communistes: Edgar Morin, Maurice Blanchot, Elio Vittorini. Exclue du PCF, opposée à la prise du pouvoir par de Gaulle en 1958, Antelme, Morin et Mascolo écrivent le Manifeste des 121 que signe Marguerite. Tous soutiennent le FLN. Un Barrage contre le Pacifique, le "roman de la mère", est une manière pour Duras d'en finir avec la famille. La vente des droits cinématographiques lui permet d'acheter une maison. C'est le début de la notoriété et de son incursion dans le cinéma (carrière mondiale du film Hiroshima mon amour, co-écrit avec Alain Resnais, l'adaptation de Moderato Cantabile par Peter Brook) et dans le théâtre avec notamment Miracle en Alabama. Après une nouvelle rupture en 1964, Marguerite sombre dans l'alcoolisme et peine à écrire. Elle se consacre alors au cinéma, soutient les immigrés, les réfugiés politiques chiliens et les féministes. En 1980, un ultime compagnon entre dans sa vie: Yann Andréa. Duras s'impose avec L'Amant, Goncourt 1984, et une forte présence médiatique (nombreux articles dans Libération, dont ceux controversés sur l'affaire Villemin, et une série d'entretiens avec Mitterrand en 1986). Elle s'éteint en mars 1996. Dans cette biographie riche d'inédits et d'entretiens, Jean Vallier dresse le portrait passionnant d'un écrivain mondialement reconnu, qui fut aussi une militante engagée. Il nous révèle une femme qui ne fut peut-être pas tout à fait celle qu'elle prétendit être à travers ses romans.
