

Centanni Di Solitudine

Da un'antica tomba nel convento delle clarisse di Cartagena emerge una lunghissima chioma rossa. Dal singolare evento, cui il giovane García Márquez, allora cronista alle prime armi, si trovò ad assistere, scaturisce questo affascinante racconto.

Nel settembre del 1967 l'Universidad Nacional de Ingeniería peruviana invita a Lima Gabriel García Márquez, che da pochi mesi ha pubblicato Cent'anni di solitudine. L'eccezionale successo lo ha reso la figura più in vista della letteratura latinoamericana, una leggenda vivente. A Lima si trova anche Mario Vargas Llosa, fresco vincitore del premio Rómulo Gallegos per La casa verde. I due futuri premi Nobel sono i protagonisti di un evento che va ben oltre le abituali conferenze: un dialogo sull'essenza e il futuro del romanzo, latinoamericano e non solo. Dalle loro parole emergono le due diverse personalità e nei vivaci scambi di battute risuonano grandi temi come la responsabilità del romanziere o il peso del convulso mondo politico sudamericano nella letteratura; ma soprattutto aleggia quel concetto di "realismo magico" che proprio da Cent'anni di solitudine si sarebbe imposto come il carattere più tipico della letteratura latinoamericana. D'altronde, in quel fatidico 1967 il boom della letteratura latinoamericana era al suo esordio: come a Macondo, «il mondo era così recente che molte cose erano senza nome».

Federico Fellini is often considered a disengaged

This book explores the contributions of psychological, neuroscientific and philosophical perspectives to the design of contemporary cities. Dwelling is a form of knowledge and re-invention of reality that involves both the tangible dimension of physical places and their mental representation. Findings in the neuroscientific field are increasingly opening stimulating perspectives on the design of spaces, and highlight how our ability to understand other people is strongly related to our corporeity. The first part of the book focuses on the contributions of various disciplines that deal with the spatial dimension, and explores the dovetailing roles that science and art can play from a

multidisciplinary perspective. In turn, the second part formulates proposals on how to promote greater integration between the aesthetic and cultural dimension in spatial design. Given its scope, the book will benefit all scholars, academics and practitioners who are involved in the process of planning, designing and building places, and will foster an international exchange of research, case studies, and theoretical reflections to confront the challenges of designing conscious places and enable the development of communities.

Drama, Creativity and Intersubjectivity presents a new theoretical approach to dramatherapy. This book explores the concept of the end of literature through the lens of Hegel's philosophy of art. In his version of Hegel's 'end of art' thesis, Arthur Danto claimed that contemporary art has abandoned its distinctive sensitive and emotive features to become increasingly reflective. Contemporary art has become a question of philosophical reflection on itself and on the world, thus producing an epochal change in art history. The core idea of this book is that this thesis applies quite well to all forms of art except one, namely literature: literature resists its 'end'. Unlike other arts, which have experienced significant fractures in the contemporary world, Campana proposes that literature has always known how to renew itself in order to retain its distinguishing features, so much so that in a way it has always come to terms with its own end. Analysing the distinct character of literature, this book proposes a new and original interpretation of the 'end of art' thesis, showing how it can be used as a key conceptual framework to understand the contemporary novel.

This essay starts up by discussing the ambiguous fortune of *Malacqua* by Nicola Pugliese, a novel written

in 1977 and from time to time seen as a literary representation of Naples so powerful to keep its up-to-dateness intact. Since a close critical reading of this novel is still missing, this essay intends to free it from some misunderstandings and identify its innovative literary coordinates. Malacqua, in fact, though grounded on chronicle suggestions, swings between La Capria and the most important European literary tradition of XX century (Joyce, Kafka), ranging from the language of D'Arrigo to Gadda's "painful" autobiographical tendency.

This book is about migrants' lives in urban space, in particular Rome and Milan. At the core of the book is literature as written by migrants, members of a "second generation," and a filmmaker who defines himself as native. It argues that the narrative authored by migrants, refugees, second generation women, and one "native Italian" perform a reparative reading of Italian spaces in order to engender reparative narratives. Eve Sedgwick wrote about our (now) traditional way of reading based on unveiling and on, mainly, negative affect. We are trained to tear the text apart, dig into it, and uncover the anxieties that define our age. Migrants writers seem to employ both positive and negative affects in defining the past, present, and future of the spaces they inhabit. Their recuperative acts of writing, constitute powerful models of changes in/on place. As they look at Italian exclusionary spaces, they also rewrite them into a

present whose transitiveness allows to imagine a process of citizenship and belong constructed from below.
