The volumes cover the beginning of Christianity until before the promulgation of the Nicene Creed at the First Council of Nicaea. This volume is accurately annotated, including * an extensive biography of the author and his life Gregory of Nyssa (c. 335 – c. 395) (also known as Gregory Nyssen) was bishop of Nyssa from 372 to 376, and from 378 until his death. He is venerated as a saint in Roman Catholicism, Eastern Orthodoxy, Oriental Orthodoxy, Lutheranism and Anglicanism. Gregory, his brother Basil of Caesarea and Gregory of Nazianzus are collectively known as the Cappadocian Fathers Gregory lacked the administrative ability of his brother Basil, or the contemporary influence of Gregory of Nazianzus, but was an erudite theologian who made significant contributions to the doctrine of the Trinity and the Nicene creed. Gregory's philosophical writings were influenced by Origen, and he is generally considered to have believed in universal salvation. Since the mid-twentieth century, there has been a significant increase in interest in Gregory's works from the academic community, which has resulted in challenges to many traditional interpretations of his theology. This beautifully bound volume of sheet music for the popular Christmas album, "Keeping Christ in Christmas" by Cathy Neff is a must have for every Christmas music collection. The cover features Greg Olsen's endearing holiday painting, "Spirit of Christmas." Composer Cathy Neff has put together a Christmas feast with songs that are all centered on Christ. This is Christmas like you've never heard it before! With new arrangements of old favorites, and some soon-to-be new favorites in styles from pop to classical, country to jazz, this album has something for everyone. "Let Him In" is a powerful ballad that reflects on the question: "If the Baby Jesus came today, would you make Him room in your inn?" Piano, vocal, and guitar. "Angels We Have Heard on High" arranged for choir with piano and organ. A must

have for your choir, or your family! You don't want to miss "Don't X Out My Christmas!" A rollicking country romp through the Christmas season with only one request: don't remove Christ from my Christmas. Lead sheet with vocals and chords. "O Come Emmanuel-What Child" is a medley of two Christmas favorites: "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" and "What Child Is This?" arranged for a solo instrument and piano or harp. Very versatile arrangement. Better yet, where are they today as we celebrate His birth? "Christmastime" is just as cute as it comes. A light, very fun look at everything that is wonderful about Christmas that makes it our favorite time of year, especially the Baby Jesus. "Lullaby, Dear Child" is another touching ballad beautifully arranged as a solo or duet. We tiptoe in to hear Mary, singing the Christ Child to sleep. "Hark! the Herald Angels Sing" is a powerful arrangement of this favorite carol. Contains SATB choir parts and piano accompaniment, with a reduction of the string parts found in the original arrangement. Easily played on an organ or assimilated into the piano part. You might never want to use another arrangement ever again! "When You Wake" is a heart melting lullaby as a parent puts their child to bed on Christmas Eve. All the tenderness of the season rolled into one melody. This will become one of your standards. "Three Ships" is a mixed-meter jazz rendition of "I Saw Three Ships." This is a jazz chart, or lead sheet, with melody, chords and rhythms for jazz players. Have fun with this one! "Christmas Eve" is a thoughtful look at the wisemen's visit and the gifts they brought, and what we could possibly give the Savior this Christmas. This arrangement of "Away in a Manger" utilizes all three of the most popular tunes for this song, one for each verse. Cathy Neff has added a fourth verse that brings the song to present day.
