Out-of-the-blue suicides that, upon investigation, bear the distinct hallmarks of murder, are all too common. Especially in the 20th and 21st centuries, the pregnancy narrative in fiction and film acts as a lightning rod with the power to electrify all genres of fiction and film, from early melodrama (*Way Down East*) to noir (*Leave Her to Heaven*); from horror (*Rosemary's Baby*) to science fiction and dystopia (*Alien*, *The Handmaid's Tale*); and from iconic (*Lolita*) to independent (*Juno*, *Precious*). Ultimately, the pregnancy narrative in popular film and fiction provides a remarkably clear lens by which we can gauge how popular American film and fiction express our most profound--and most private--fears, values and hopes.
