An analogy is a comparison between two things. It points out the similarities between two things that might be different in all other respects. Analogies cause us to think analytically about forms, uses, structures, and relationships. The book is divided into four sections that let you introduce analogies in a developmental way. The levels are: recognizing relationships; choosing one item to complete the analogy; given two items, choosing two other items that have the same relationships; and pairing up four items to complete two related pairs. Exercises are presented on worksheets that require circling the correct answer, as well as cutting out pictures and pasting them in the correct spaces. Attractive illustrations will draw students into the engaging exercises. Although they think they are just solving fun puzzles, they will be doing serious thinking and building a basis for future experiences in critical thinking. This is the first in a series of books that introduce analogies at varying difficulties and formats. The Mango Rain is an epic narrative about a small group of Americans and Vietnamese caught up in the dramatic events that swept Indochina during the 1956-1975 period. For them this period brought an odyssey, a journey full of adventures, changing fortunes, and quests in their own hearts. The peaceful late 1950s is a golden afternoon, a time of love and youthful vision as exquisite as the mango rain which comes in the hot dry season to bring a cool respite that is, alas, all too fleeting. Sadly, with the Communist insurgency in the early 1960s, the golden afternoon is darkened and then obliterated by the Vietnam War. In the face of ever-growing violence and destruction, life takes on more sharply drawn lines. The Mango Rain also tells in the stories of insurgents, Khanh, Cay, and Tai how during the 1950s and early 1960s, the Viet Cong successfully blends into the South Vietnamese society to bomb the American embassy, and confront the South Vietnamese Army. As the Vietnam War draws to a close in April 1975 there is little left of the 1950s Vietnam. Still, on the day the Communist troops enter Saigon, Tho Van, who refuses to leave with Peggy and Stan, moves through her garden and looks up as the soft, fragrant mango rain falls. In Tho Van's shattered world, the mango rain is a reminder of the vanished past, but it also is a sign of hope.

Predatory pricing has long been a contentious issue among lawmakers and economists. Legal actions are continually brought against companies. But the question remains: how likely are firms to cut prices in order to drive rivals out of business? Predatory firms risk having to keep prices below cost for such an extended period that it would become cost-prohibitive. Recently, economists have turned to game theory to examine circumstances under which predatory tactics could be profitable. John R. Lott, Jr. provides long-awaited empirical analysis in this book. By examining firms accused of or convicted of predation over a thirty-year period of time, he shows that these firms are not organized as the game-theoretic or other models of predation would predict. In contrast, what evidence exists for predation suggests that government enterprises are more of a threat. Lott presents crucial new data and analysis, attacking an issue of major legal and economic importance. This impressive work will be of great interest to economists, legal scholars, and antitrust policy makers.

Fr. Mitch Pacwa has a gift for opening up the Scriptures, and he offers Catholics such a gift in this book of meditations on the beginnings of Jesus' public ministry. Based on Ignatian principles, the thirty-nine meditations are meant to help readers use their imagination to enter into the Gospel scene and experience the presence of Jesus. From Jesus' baptism in the Jordan to his temptation in the desert and the wedding feast at Cana, Fr. Pacwa provides fascinating background information about the text, such as the geography of Palestine and Jewish customs and ideas. Then he asks a series of questions that are intended to lead readers into a deeper examination of their own life and mission in the world today.
