Children and adolescents are affected by a large range of diseases with oral manifestations that may not be seen in adults. Such diseases include viral and bacterial infections, but many other conditions as well, for example, after swallowing caustic liquids. As with the author's immensely successful Color Atlas of Oral Diseases, this new work is lavishly illustrated with high-quality color photographs, providing the reader with an at-a-glance diagnostic guide. Succinct texts in tabular form complement the images to help the reader formulate a differential diagnosis and a treatment plan.

We have felt for some years that an atlas of paediatric dermatology merited a place in the world dermatological literature. Non-dermatologists find skin conditions difficult to describe and diagnose and this may be even more difficult in children. We usually rely on the parents for a history in children, although many conditions can be suspected. In this atlas we have tried to illustrate conditions seen regularly in our clinics as well as some seen more rarely but which are nevertheless important to recognize. We have limited the number of illustrations in order to produce a realistically-priced book and thus it has not always been easy to decide what to include and what to omit. However, we hope that we have produced a reasonably comprehensive work. We hope that this atlas will have a wide appeal both at home and abroad. It is a book either to read or to browse through. It is intended for senior medical students, family practitioners, and for trainees both in dermatology and in paediatrics. We would like it actually taken to skin clinics to be available for instant perusal, and to be on hand in the paediatric ward. We have said comparatively little about treatment because this alters regularly and often varies in different centres and because we do not think that an atlas is the place for this.

This outstanding new atlas provides vital information on the epidemiology, diagnosis, symptoms and prevention of HIV infection and AIDS observed among patients in tropical regions. While the specific opportunistic infections and malignancies associated with HIV infection vary in different areas, the lessons to be learned from careful study of this atlas will be highly useful to clinicians in all parts of the world. The capacity to diagnose is fundamental to the care and management of this disease. A Colour Atlas of AIDS in the Tropics will broaden your perspective on the worldwide challenge.
