Securing Development: Public Finance and the Security Sector highlights the role of public finance in the delivery of security and criminal justice services. The primary audience includes government officials bearing both security and financial responsibilities, staff of international organizations working on public expenditure management and security sector issues, academics, and development practitioners working in an advisory capacity.

An earlier book, "Life as a Professor", highlighted the challenges that are encountered in teaching current business and technology methods in colleges and universities, along with recommendations for solutions that are needed now in classrooms. A later book, "E-Commerce Concepts", discussed strategies to use when a business wanted to take advantage of e-commerce to increase their sales and international exposure. Another book, "MBA Strategic Analysis", discussed methods to use to assess business strengths so that opportunities for growth can be more effectively implemented.
