When I was seventeen I watched for the first time a movie that made me dream. Even though the main character of the movie was greedy and ruthless I wanted to be part of that game. On the other hand, I eventually enrolled in an MBA to understand more about the real world, rather than focusing solely on financial markets and stock prices. As an MBA I took as concentration corporate finance and a new world opened in front of my eyes. In fact, I could finally find a subject that although artificial (we make many assumptions in corporate finance) it was way more coherent to reality than pure financial speculation. I found this learning experience very challenging, considering that corporate finance was out of my domain (I had a legal background) but like all stimulating adventures eventually it turned better than I could ever expect. In these years trying to fit

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complex financial concepts in my already overloaded brain made me simplify things.
