Con el convencimiento de que estudiar Biología siempre es un viaje apasionante hacia el conocimiento de todo lo que rodea al ser vivo en su máxima amplitud, en este libro estudiaremos desde el nivel más elemental de la materia viva (las moléculas químicas que la forman) hasta el nivel más complejo, correspondiente al organismo completo. Conoceremos el funcionamiento celular a nivel molecular, la información que los seres vivos tenemos almacenada en forma de ADN y sus formas de transmisión que aseguran tanto la conservación como la variabilidad de las distintas especies.
