

Diego Giacometti Catalogue De Loeuvre

171 paintings concentrated on works produced by Henri Matisse during the 1920s, when he lived in the South of France.

Aux tout derniers jours de l'Allemagne nazie, Julia – dont le mari s'est tué à Paris pour lui épargner la torture dans les locaux de la Gestapo –, Claudine, infirmière communiste, Lucette, mannequin de haute couture, Gisèle, violoniste, se trouvent brusquement libérées d'un centre de réclusion en Saxe. Katie, officier anglais sortie d'un camp de la mort, les y rejoint. Elles découvrent qu'elles sont un gage dans une tentative de paix lancée lors de la chute du Reich par Himmler, patron des SS. Charles, rescapé, attend Julia au Lutetia, à Paris, où rentrent les déportés. Tel est le point de départ du roman *Les revenantes*. La victoire venue, qui voudrait entendre d'où et de quoi elles reviennent ? Et pourront-elles retrouver la vie « normale » des jours sans guerre ? Pierre Daix a vécu, à la fin d'avril 1945, la libération des femmes occidentales détenues à Mauthausen. Il a écrit entre 2001 et 2008 ce roman de survivant qu'il a porté sa vie durant. Né en 1922 à Ivry-sur-Seine, Pierre Daix a interrompu des études d'histoire pour entrer dans la Résistance à l'automne 1940, puis a été déporté à Mauthausen. Rédacteur en chef des *Lettres françaises* de 1948 à 1972, il collabore après 1980 au *Quotidien de Paris* et au *Figaro littéraire*. Il a publié, entre autres, seize romans et une autobiographie : *Tout mon temps*. Historien d'art, il a également écrit de nombreuses monographies de peintres.

Analyse: Basé sur la banque de données de l'Institut suisse pour l'étude de l'art (ISEA), cet ouvrage fournit une biographie sur les artistes actifs en Suisse dans le domaine des beaux-arts entre 1980 et 1990 ainsi que sur les artistes suisses vivant à l'étranger.

"In a career spanning over six decades, the New York art dealer Pierre Matisse (1900-1989) contributed substantially to the advancement of modern art. At his eponymous gallery on East Fifty-seventh Street, he showed several now legendary artists for the first time outside Europe. The collection--paintings, sculpture, and drawings by Balthus, Bonnard, Chagall, Derain, Dubuffet, Giacometti, Magritte, and the dealer's own father, Henri Matisse, among others--was donated to The Metropolitan Museum of Art in 2004 by the foundation established by his widow. These extraordinary artworks are presented with informative entries addressing the circumstances of each work's creation and the dealer's relationship to the artist. Jean-Michel Frank (1895-1941) is a mythical figure in the decorative arts. His style described as "poor luxury" is just as paradoxical as his life between parties and solitude, with loyal friendships for poets, artists who were decisive in the development of his aesthetic, but also his clients, people of the world of fashion or intellectuals. Forcing them to get rid of their objects, their paintings and their carpets, Frank invented for them places conducive to meditation and dreams, furniture of perfect simplicity, close to a French neoclassicism stripped of its ornaments. Indifferent to the great debates of the first half of a twentieth century, Jean-Michel Frank did not seek to build a new world or to cling to a nostalgic past. With elegance, he broke conventions, cleaned up the places of their history. Perhaps it is this mixture of lightness and rigor, of dreams and poetry, this very current diversion of objects and materials that have led so many decorators and contemporary designers to claim him.

Expanded to twice as many entries as the 1985 edition, and updated with new publications, new editions of previous entries, titles missed the first time around, more of the artists' own writings, and monographs that deal with significant aspects or portions of an artist's work though not all of it. The listing is alphabetical by artist, and the index by author. The works cited include analytical and critical, biographical, and enumerative; their formats range from books and catalogues raisonnées to exhibition and auction sale catalogues. "Space does not exist," the Swiss sculptor Alberto Giacometti (1901-1966) wrote in 1949. "It has to be created... Every sculpture made on the assumption that space exists is wrong, there is only the illusion of space."
