New and selected works from the master prankster and art saboteur  
Accompanying Maurizio Cattelan's (born 1960) solo exhibition of the same name  
at Pirelli HangarBicocca, *Breath Ghosts* Blindfollows the artist's first show in Italy  
for many years. The exhibition intermixes the artist's classic pieces with a new  
body of work, paralleling the show's thematic core: the cycle of life and the  
relationship between individual and collective memory. The fully illustrated

Cyberpragmatics is an analysis of Internet-mediated communication from the

To many, chance and art are antagonistic terms. But a number of 20th century artists have turned this notion on its head by attempting to create artworks based on randomness. Among those, three in particular articulated a well-argued and thorough theory of the radical use of chance in art: André Breton (writer), John Cage (composer) and François Morellet (visual artist). The implications of such a move away from established aesthetics are far-reaching, as much in conceptual

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as in practical terms, as this book hopes to make clear. Of paramount importance in this coincidentia oppositorum is the suggested possibility of a correlation between the artistic use of chance and a system of thought itself organised around chance. Indeed placing randomness at the centre of one's art may have deeper philosophical consequences than just on the aesthetical level.

Creative practice in music, particularly in traditional concert culture, is commonly understood in terms of a rather stark division of labour between composer and performer. But this overlooks the distributed and interactive nature of the creative processes on which so much contemporary music depends. The incorporation of two features-improvisation and collaboration-into much contemporary music suggests that the received view of the relationship between composition and performance requires reassessment. Improvisation and collaborative working practices blur the composition/performance divide and, in doing so, provide important new perspectives on the forms of distributed creativity that play a central part in much contemporary music. *Distributed Creativity: Collaboration and Improvisation in Contemporary Music* explores the different ways in which collaboration and improvisation enable and constrain creative processes.

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contemporary improvisation practices. 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tolerance for “heterodoxy.” The view from Fuan offers an original account of how a locality created its own religious culture in Ming-Qing China within a context both global and local, and illuminates the historical dynamics contributing to the remarkable growth of Christian communities in present-day China.
