Instead of joining groups or focusing on deviant behavior, Williams channeled his thoughts and dreams on becoming an author. After his registry by the Library of Congress for *Written Fullfillment* in 2014, he started having ideas for his second book of poems, *Poems with No Glass Shield in Twenty-fifteen: 25 Short Poems: Volume 1*. He began the first draft of the book in November 2014 and completed it in July 2015. With *Poems with No Glass Shield*, Williams demonstrated a complex style of poetry that allows readers to derive their own conclusions from a variety of translations for one poem. Although the length of one poem is moderate in size, it shares common interest in today's times and current events.

In addition, there are extensive notes at the end of the volume, including significant textual variants, and full details of Butler's sources and references, as well as short summaries of Butler's predecessors, and a selective bibliography.
