

## Foglie Derba Testo Inglese A Fronte

As he was turning forty, Walt Whitman wrote twelve poems in a small handmade book he entitled “Live Oak, With Moss.” The poems were intensely private reflections on his attraction to and affection for other men. They were also Whitman’s most adventurous explorations of the theme of same-sex love, composed decades before the word “homosexual” came into use. This revolutionary, extraordinarily beautiful and passionate cluster of poems was never published by Whitman and has remained unknown to the general public—until now. New York Times bestselling and Caldecott Award–winning illustrator Brian Selznick offers a provocative visual narrative of “Live Oak, With Moss,” and Whitman scholar Karen Karbiener reconstructs the story of the poetic cluster’s creation and destruction. «Se à ancora una copia dei 'Canti Orfici' me la mandi, mi farà molto piacere: io li ebbi solo in lettura da Boine che li ricevette indirettamente»: così scriveva, nel gennaio del 1916, Mario Novaro, industriale oleario, poeta-filosofo e direttore della rivista «la Riviera ligure» di Oneglia, a Dino Campana, autore 'unius libri', che nell'estate del 1914 aveva pubblicato, presso un tipografo del suo paese, quella che ebbe a definire «la sola giustificazione della 'sua' esistenza». Il «poeta notturno», già collaboratore della rivista dell'«Olio Sasso», l'avrebbe accontentato qualche giorno più tardi, inviando una copia

dei 'Canti Orfici' con dedica autografa. Ora quell'esemplare, tuttora custodito presso la Biblioteca della «Fondazione Mario Novaro» di Genova, è riprodotto per la prima volta in questa edizione anastatica curata da Fabio Barricalla e Andrea Lanzola, arricchita non solo da un testo apocrifo di Marco Ercolani, e da una nota di Veronica Pesce, ma anche dal celeberrimo 'plauso' di Giovanni Boine, che tanto avrebbe contribuito alla fama del pazzo di Marradi. Con questa operazione culturale, in collaborazione con la «Fondazione Novaro», Matisklo edizioni intende mettere a disposizione di un amplissimo pubblico, di studiosi e di semplici lettori, un esemplare poco o nulla conosciuto di un'opera capitale del Novecento poetico italiano.

Quando l'idea di «classici americani» sembrava una contraddizione in termini, D.H. Lawrence fu il primo a individuare nella letteratura americana dell'Ottocento una specifica tradizione nazionale, fatta di tragica e disperata vitalità, di ipocrisia, rettitudine e continua capacità di trasformazione, e costruita in aperta antitesi alla cultura europea. Merito di per sé considerevole, ma che appare quasi trascurabile non appena ci si rende conto che questo libro offre, più che una sequenza di sia pur illuminanti saggi critici, una vera e propria galleria di ritratti psichici – di Fenimore Cooper e Edgar Allan Poe, Nathaniel Hawthorne e Herman Melville –, animati da una voce inconfondibile, ora beffarda e insinuante, ora imperiosa e tonante. Ritratti che non cessano di provocarci, di sfidarci a un inesauribile incontro e scontro con Lawrence e con gli autori di cui parla. Originally published in 1889, this work's protagonist Andrea Sperelli introduced the Italian culture to aestheticism and a taste for decadence. The young count seeks beauty, despises the bourgeois world, and rejects the basic rules of morality and social interaction. His corruption is evident in his sadistic superimposing of two women. In questa edizione viene presentata per la prima volta al lettore la seconda versione della raccolta, risalente al 1856, in cui Whitman include numerosi nuovi componimenti e decide di dare un titolo a ognuno. «Celebro me stesso, E ciò che immagino tu immaginerai, Perché ogni atomo che appartiene a me appartiene davvero anche a te.»

Walt Whitman nato nel 1819 e giunto a New York in tenera età, dopo gli studi presso la scuola pubblica sperimentò diversi lavori: fu fattorino, apprendista, insegnante e in seguito tipografo. L'inizio dell'attività giornalistica coincise con i primi tentativi poetici e con un misterioso viaggio a New Orleans, unico nella sua vita. È del 1855 la nascita di Foglie d'erba, cui l'autore dedicherà una costante rivisitazione. Dapprima ignorato e in seguito osteggiato, anche per la carica omoerotica dei suoi versi, si vedrà costretto all'autocensura prima di ottenere i dovuti riconoscimenti. Morì nel 1892.

Les Fleurs du mal is a volume of French poetry by Charles Baudelaire. First published in 1857, it was important in the symbolist and modernist movements. The poems deal

with themes relating to decadence and eroticism.

Leaves of Grass is a poetry collection by the American poet Walt Whitman (1819-1892). Although the first edition was published in 1855, Whitman spent most of his professional life writing and re-writing Leaves of Grass, revising it multiple times until his death. This resulted in vastly different editions over four decades-the first a small book of twelve poems and the last a compilation of over 400.

The essence of famous American poet and essayist Walt Whitman is captured in the collection "Song of Myself and Other Poems." Whitman wrote in the time when Transcendentalism was fading and Realism was becoming more popular. As a result, his works encompass traits of both eras. His first work was an American epic called "Leaves of Grass." He kept revising the collection until his death issuing several editions and ultimately it contained some of the most famous poems that Whitman ever created. "Song of Myself" is hailed as Whitman's best and most widespread poem. In the poem, the author creates a persona that is both an individual as well as a universal voice for the people. Typical of Whitman's style, "Song of Myself" is written in free

verse, allowing the narrator to appeal to a wide variety of readers.
