

Gioconda

In a novel based on the Bible and ancient traditions, Adam and Eve discover the world around them, react to their punishment, and learn to adjust to the outside world, where it is necessary to kill to survive.

Los maestros del arte moderno han luchado contra el academicismo; pero el arte moderno, en nuestra época, se encuentra en vías de crear un nuevo academicismo, tal vez peor que el anterior; ya que en éste, por lo menos, existían vestigios de técnica. Hoy casi nadie sabe dibujar ni pintar. Creo que el arte moderno es un gran desastre. Pero algo es cierto, no obstante: el arte moderno es el único arte vivo que existe hoy, el único que corresponde históricamente al tiempo en que vivimos; tiempo tan desastroso. Desde los primeros años, y sobre todo en los momentos de mayor creatividad –entre 1924 y 1945–, Dalí trabaja de manera paralela en los campos de la literatura y la pintura, que unidos contribuyen a la creación de un universo de formas y símbolos que no abandonará hasta el final de sus días. Los textos recogidos en esta antología corresponden a épocas distintas que van desde 1927 a 1978; fueron publicados en la revista francesa *Oui* y esta edición los rescata en su totalidad. El orden cronológico de los artículos permite seguir con más facilidad

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la evolución de las ideas del artista. Sus obsesiones son su principal fuente temática: el erotismo, la muerte y la podredumbre, que articulan un universo muy peculiar apareciendo de manera recurrente a lo largo de toda su vida. Cuando se ocupa de estos temas, Dalí se convierte en un auténtico surrealista. Pero la temática daliniana va más allá de lo puramente personal. En sus escritos mezcla ideas filosóficas con anécdotas aparentemente irrelevantes y se preocupa también por el surrealismo y algunos de sus problemas, como el objeto, el automatismo o el sueño, sin dejar de lado otros temas como la fotografía y el cine.

La Gioconda is a boozy, rock and roll love story about a Canadian college student who meets a beautiful young exchange student from France, and their unexpected immediate connection as they're surrounded by a whirlwind of marijuana sex-jaunts and live-band, late-night drunk loving. ¿Cuál es la verdadera identidad que se esconde tras el cuadro más famoso del mundo? Existen al menos cinco referencias históricas reales que certifican la existencia de un retrato femenino de manos de Leonardo da Vinci. Un encargo que, al parecer, nunca entregó. A new novel inspired by the shocking true historical accounts of the haunted Ropes Mansion in Salem, Massachusetts is being released. 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George about living in the Ropes, but he is convinced he can uncover the mystery. The family is torn apart after George becomes increasingly obsessed with uncovering the dark history of Salem and their new home. He discovers mysterious objects and Masonic symbols carved onto the walls of their basement. After a smoke alarm goes off in the middle of the night, firefighters discover smoldering embers behind a basement wall - along with strange human remains. Police are called and suspect that there is more to the story than George will admit. Like countless others in the Ropes house before, George and his family fight a descent into madness.

Five hundred years can confuse identity. An old chalk drawing of a girl, Maria, the daughter of a Chianti vintner leaves a Swiss art collector, Claude Beauvin entangled in a Renaissance love story from the past. The drawing is currently owned by a reclusive young widow, Andrea Garibaldi-Chase, who puts the drawing up for auction. With smoldering rumors that Leonardo da Vinci is the artist of the portrait, history is set on fire by a New York art dealer, an art history professor, and an intellectual property crimes investigator from INTERPOL who are all caught up in the drawings history. It's not until after the auction that Beauvin learns who the girl really was, what influence she had over da Vinci and the centuries since, and how his growing feelings for Andrea transcends time and identity.

La historia del hallazgo que ha revolucionado la Historia del Arte y el Museo del Prado. La Gioconda, el retrato más famoso del mundo, tenía una hermana gemela en el Museo del Prado escondida a la vista de todo el mundo.
