We use the Simple Present Tense to talk about facts, routines, and habitual activities. Chapter 4 is a comparison of chapter 3 and 4. Each chapter has the same "layout" (arrangement, presentation, design, organization). First there is a section to "activate", or prepare your mind for learning. It includes a discussion with your classmates. Next you read a story about some ESOL students whose lives may be similar to yours. Then we break verb learning into many smaller sections for ease of learning, such as; affirmative/negative/yes/no questions/information questions (other important things to know)
