With hope still left to save Carys, Marty Strauss, although reluctant to get involved in the old man Whitehead's deserved punishment, decides to get involved and attempt to save the innocent gifted addict from being another victim to the damnation game.

Translated from the Italian by Ann McGarrell Half-memoir, half-meditation, 'Eros' presents an account of the commanding role of physical love in a man's life.
