The American Expeditionary Force, fighting alongside French and British troops, provided vital manpower on the Western Front during the Aisne Offensive and participated in major actions in the Saint-Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne offensives that turned the tide late in the war. After an overview of each of the actions and battles in which the AEF participated, the book chronicles the day-to-day activities of every division.
