Introduce children to opposites in this tabbed, brightly illustrated board book! In this first concept book, little ones can turn the tabbed pages to learn about opposites! The spreads feature the concepts of up and down (a rocket and car), long and short (two snakes), slow and fast (tortoise and bunny), loud and quiet (two lions), and big and small (two dinosaurs).

Mother and child ponder the different ways a dinosaur can say goodnight, from slamming his tail and pouting to giving a big hug and kiss, in a picture book featuring ten sleepy dinosaurs which includes the names of each dinosaur on the end papers.
