MY PHILOSOPHY: I HAVE ALWAYS DECLINED the request to expound my philosophy shortly in a popular way, partly because philosophy, like any other work of man, can only be really understood by those who are of the trade, and partly because this possessive my has a bad sound. Any craftsman who takes up the job which a fellow-worker or pre decessor has dropped, and carries it on towards perfection does not call it his but our work. But I have now reached the age when, as Giovanni Prati wrote, there rises in the heart the sadness of the days that are no more. It was his fortune to know sadness but not, as we do, to despair in the encircling gloom of slaughter and destruction of all that we held dear or sacred. I have reached the age when a mans life seems a past that he can survey at a single glance, and when he himself takes his place in history, or to put it more plainly, he looks at himself as if he were dead. That is why I am now willing to comply briefly, so far as is modest and reasonable, with the request. Consistently with my simile of a craft as always a matter of colla boration, we must get rid of the pretence or illusion that a philo sopher's work or system is a self-

completed revelation of the so-called mystery of reality...

Entering the vigorous debate about the nature of the American welfare state, *The Wages of Motherhood* illuminates ways in which a "maternalist" social policy emerged from the crucible of gender and racial politics between the world wars. Gwendolyn Mink here examines the cultural dynamics of maternalist social policy, which have often been overlooked by institutional and class analyses of the welfare state. Mink maintains that the movement for welfare provisions, while resulting in important gains, reinforced existing patterns of gender and racial inequality. She explores how Anglo American women reformers, as they gained increasing political recognition, promoted an ideology of domesticity that became the core of maternalist social policy. Focusing on reformers such as Jane Addams, Grace Abbott, Katherine Lenroot, and Frances Perkins, Mink shows how they helped shape a social policy premised on moral character and cultural conformity rather than universal entitlement.

This wholly remarkable, almost unparalleled strip (there were only two feeble imitations in the 1920s, both short-lived) brought the charm and gaucherie of the silent cinema to the daily comic page, presenting endless programs of mildly satirical take-offs on silent feature films, newsreels, travelogues, and animated cartoons within the compass of its daily ten to sixteen panels of intricately-detailed but crisply clear graphic continuity. Inventing his own studio and cast of major players fitted to the basic parts found in most silent features, Ed Wheelan first called his strip "Midget Movies" in the early 1920s, then changed the title to the better-known "Minute Movies" when he took control of his feature at the close of that decade. Followed by hundreds of thousands of movie and strip fans at the height of its fame and wide newspaper distribution, the strip died almost as precipitously as the silent films to which it was wedded thematically in the early 1930s. A notably memorable part of its era, and an essential element in any analysis of popular response to the movies of its time, *Minute Movies* is represented in this collection by a typical year of continuity from the peak period of its fame.
