

Magni Bene E Spenni Poco

The use of wooden vessels for storage, transportation, fermentation or aging of beer is deeply rooted in history. Brewing luminaries Dick Cantwell and Peter Bouckaert explore the many influences of wood as a vehicle for contributing tremendous complexity to beers fermented and aged within it. Stephen Leacock is regarded as one of Canada's finest writers, known for his wit and humour, at one point becoming the best known humorist in the English-speaking world. This collection of articles was published posthumously by his niece. Many of the earliest books, particularly those dating back to the 1900s and before, are now extremely scarce and increasingly expensive. Hesperides Press are republishing these classic works in affordable, high quality, modern editions, using the original text and artwork.

Giorgio Saviane is the Italian publishing scandal. Author of at least twenty novels published by Mondadori, Rizzoli, Rusconi, was totally forgotten. His books won major awards. It was, as they say, a successful writer, but since 2000, year of his death we have lost his editorials trace. Why? Certainly he was an unusual genius, an obnoxious. Of course, he wrote books magnetic but turbid, bumping. Yes, he did not attend the literary club, but the mystery of his disappearance into the black hole of literary galaxy remains. This is the English version of "Il Papa" which, in 1963, proclaimed Saviane as a new voice of contemporary Italian fiction. A novel which expresses the beginnings of a spiritual sensitivity that will be present in the major part of Saviane's work.

Many students of Spanish literature will have encountered some of Góngora's poems. No Spanish poet is grater or more rewarding, but few are as difficult for the beginner. His style is a habit of mind: radically metaphorical, elliptical, witty, highly sensuous, transmuting the world of the sense into a world of the spirit. To read him, one has to learn these characteristic habits and perform athletic mental feats as one goes along. It would be too easy to say that Professor Jones has made Góngora 'easy'; but he has certainly made him more accessible. A long introduction briefly deals with Góngora's life, and then gives solid critical guidance to the poems. It includes passages of sustained and detailed analysis which explain how characteristic poems 'work' and it incorporates original insights and research. The notes are full and are designed to help the reader through the difficulties by offering critical comment.

Lo scopo è quello di dimostrare che nella Capitale si può non solo mangiar bene ma anche a buon mercato. Se ci sia riuscito o meno, ai lettori – o meglio – ai commensali l'ardua sentenza. Secondo l'autore, la regola principale è quella di affidarsi alla "saggezza della folla": alla larga dai locali vuoti o semivuoti. La preferenza va data a quelli affollati, anche restando qualche minuto in attesa o magari prenotando in anticipo, perché il loro affollamento è sicuramente dovuto all'ottimo rapporto qualità/prezzo. Roma è sempre stata la somma di insediamenti e di esperienze diverse che hanno contribuito alla formazione di variegata atmosfere, culturali ma anche gastronomiche, che si trascinano tuttora. Da secoli non c'è più un solo "centro storico", con la sua piazza principale (quello che un tempo era il Foro) ma, dal secondo dopoguerra, vi sono anche tante periferie, con la loro storia e le loro culture. Non si è potuto rinunciare, perciò, alla differenziazione degli esercizi in base alla loro localizzazione, anche perché, data l'estensione ormai raggiunta dall'abitato, la domanda: "cosa vogliamo mangiare?" oggi, è preceduta da quella, forse più appropriata: "dove si va a mangiare?" May I also suggest that you will ask your little children who are ignorant of the causes of poverty, wretchedness and exploitation-may I suggest that you ask these innocent children to whisper a prayer for one who fully recognizes how unworthy he is but who fully realizes what a golden opportunity God has given to him to be an instrument for good. You are anxious to know what topics I shall discuss during the insuing year. Roundly speaking, it is my hope that these addresses will be concerned chiefly with Christian social justice. While my ultimate objective is to help more and more men to save their immortal souls, I

recognize how difficult it is for man to practice Christian virtue, to live a holy life in peace and contentment, when he and a great group of his fellowmen are denied unjustly an equitable share in the goods and wealth of this world-goods and wealth which our common Father in heaven bestowed upon all men for all men to use and enjoy-goods and wealth, which, alas, have been concentrated in the hands of a few to the detriment of the many because an un-Christian species of social injustice was foisted upon us in the past few centuries and because, as a result of this, an alien philosophy of social injustice, under the name either of Communism or Naziism, is endeavoring to win our allegiance today. Fearlessly, Christian social justice challenges these several systems for the attention and the support, in this instance, of the American public-a public composed of persons who, despite their many faults and shortcomings, will never surrender the heritage of Bethlehem, of Pilate's hall, of Calvary Hill or of the Easter morning sepulchre from whose empty depths there echo and re-echo the immortal words, "I am the Resurrection and the Life." Fortified with these precious heritages it is our hope to carry on a campaign of instruction and inspiration even though we find ourselves opposed by the rugged individualists on the right and by the unchristly radicals on the left. It is our hope to convert a zealous band of followers into a group of active Christians-. Christians who, by the sincerity of their lives and the logic of their doctrines shall win millions of followers who are convinced that there is no way other than Christ's way for saving America and restoring prosperity and peace for all. My friends, at the outset, permit me to clarify the fundamental doctrine of Christian social justice-the doctrine that differentiates it from every other plan of life proposed for man to follow. It is this: Christ came on earth not only to redeem and save individuals but also to establish an absolutely new social order. Recognizing the chaotic condition of society in His own time; aware of the universal slavery practiced virtually by every nation; and conscious of the spiritual darkness which had encompassed every kingdom, empire, republic and tribe, our Saviour well understood that man, left to his natural abilities, was unable to acquire peace and prosperity in this world and save his immortal soul in the hereafter.
