Bernard Moitessier is a writer and one of France's most famous sailors.

The supremacy of pure feeling Dabbling in fauvism and cubism before founding the Suprematist movement, Russian painter and sculptor Kasimir Malevich (1879-1935) was a leading figure of the avant-garde and a pioneer of the non-objective style that he felt would "free viewers from the material world." In 1915, the same year he produced his most famous painting, "Black Square," he published the manifesto From Cubism to Suprematism. To critics who accused his work of being devoid of beauty and nature, he responded "art does not need us, and it never did." His 1918 painting "Suprematist Composition: White on White," one of the most radical artworks of its time, fetched \$60 million at auction in 2008. Best known for his iconic Woolmark logo, Franco Grignani (1908-1999) was an influential artist and graphic designer whose dazzling works anticipated Op Art. Briefly affiliated with the Futurist movement as a young painter, he subsequently adopted a geometric abstract style that revealed an increasing fascination with optical effects and perceptual processes. From the late 1940s onward, Grignani's works took inspiration from Gestalt Psychology, and were characterized by their use of dynamic forms and 'virtual' shapes that seem to warp out of, and recede back into, the surfaces of his compositions. Initially, Grignani's experimental approach was not understood by the artistic establishment of the day, and he worked largely in isolation. Yet he achieved great success as a graphic designer, creating striking advertising campaigns for a variety of high-profile companies including Pirelli, Fiat and Alfieri & Lacroix, as well as producing covers for a series of science fiction novels published by Penguin during the late 1960s. Its production was also widespread in former colonies and drew upon local influences. Azulejo artists were influenced by different movements and styles, from the 'manuelino' (mixing elements of Gothic, Mauritanian, and Indian motifs) to modernism and later 20th-century styles. Azulejos were often used in the 16th century to decorate church interiors, especially around the altar. Throughout the history of this ceramic tradition, flowers are a prominently recurring motif. From floral Arabesque patterns to modern interpretations, this collection features an array of beautiful examples.

A massive anthology of the exhibitions of the late, great Germano Celant, the Italian curator who named *Arte Povera* and created countless landmark shows of postwar European art. When Italian art critic and curator Germano Celant died in 2020 at the age of 79, he left behind a legacy of curatorial philosophy that decisively shaped postwar art in the West, and will undoubtedly influence future generations of curators. In 1967, Celant published his manifesto "Notes for a Guerrilla War" in which he coined the term *Arte Povera* to classify Italy's artistic counter to the Pop art trends prevailing in the United States and the United Kingdom at the time. This publication provides a chronology of 34 exhibitions curated by Celant, beginning with the first *Arte Povera* gallery show in 1967 and closing with the sprawling 2018 Prada Foundation show *Post Zang Tumb Tuuum: Art Life Politics: Italia 1918-1943*. Appraising the exhibitions as well as the theoretical writings from their respective catalogs, this volume seeks to reconstruct the most important shows of Celant's career from initial conception to public reception. *The Story of (MY) Exhibition* explores the unique approach to curation that characterized Celant's life and work. His career trajectory is a nonlinear evolution of personal interpretation and historical documentation that prioritizes nontraditional media and strives to break down boundaries between different artistic languages.

Presenting a selection of the *décollages* (torn posters) and *retro d'affiches* (untouched poster versos) of Nouveau Réaliste pioneer Mimmo Rotella (1918-2006) from the late '50s and early '60s, this book situates these works in the artistic climate that helped foster them.

A clothbound collection of KAWS' instantly recognizable riffs on pop culture, featuring bold graphics and a familiar cast of characters. Few artists have managed to bridge the gap between high and low culture as seamlessly as KAWS has since his career took off in the 1990s: his iconic cartoon-inspired designs have graced fashion collections, vinyl figurines, and skateboards as well as canvases sold for millions of dollars. Frequently

portraying familiar figures such as Mickey Mouse and Spongebob Squarepants with cauliflower ears and X'ed-out eyes, KAWS employs a sophisticated dark humor throughout his work, exploring the relationship between art and consumerism. This publication documents the artist's first exhibit in the Middle East, with more than 40 key pieces in sculpture and painting from the last two decades. The exhibit in Doha, Qatar, and its accompanying catalog also feature a number of KAWS' commercial collaborations alongside his 5-meter-tall sculpture Companion (Passing Through) and his inflatable 40-meter-tall piece Holiday. Bound in cloth, this volume is a gorgeous collection of KAWS' most exciting work. Brian Donnelly (born 1974), known professionally by his graffiti tag KAWS, is the mastermind behind one of today's most recognizable artistic brands. A graffiti artist since adolescence, Donnelly received his BFA in illustration from the School of Visual Arts in 1996. He then worked as a background artist for animated TV programs before becoming an independent designer. He has worked with artists like Kanye West and collaborated with brands such as Supreme, Nike and Comme des Garçons. He is currently represented by Perrotin in New York.

Frida Kahlo, Mexican artist and champion of justice and women's rights, transformed the pain and suffering of her life into enduringly powerful paintings. This XXL monograph brings together all of Kahlo's 152 paintings in stunning reproductions. Bruno Munari (1907-1998) played a pioneering role in the evolution of twentieth-century art and design, his work exerting an influence that stretched far beyond the borders of Italy. Munari described the roots of his work as his 'Futurist past', but his influences were extremely varied, also reflecting the aesthetics and sensibilities of Constructivism, Dada and Surrealism. This book is dedicated to the complex artistic trajectory of Chiara Fumai, who played a significant role in the development of performance and feminist aesthetics in the twenty-first century and who died prematurely in 2017, at the age of only thirty-nine. Conceived as a critical monograph on Fumai's work as a visual artist, performer, DJ and music curator, 'Poems I Will Never Release' is the first volume to trace the entirety of her artistic path: from her scathing video performances and large-scale installations, to her more intimist practices of automatic writing and collage and her incursions into music.0Almost 500 pages long, the volume is divided into three main chapters. The first of these brings together essays by prominent writers, curators and artists who examine Chiara Fumai's work from various perspectives, highlighting its intersections with anarchism, feminism, ideological forms and discourses of power and oppression, the animal rights movement, theater, surrealism and esotericism. The second chapter presents an imposing iconographic apparatus that documents Chiara Fumai's entire

artistic production, from 2007 to 2017, while the third offers an exhaustively detailed chronology and bibliography.

He describes his service in the Italian Army in the First World War, his return to Paris, his association with the surrealist movement, and his subsequent disillusionment and self-isolation.

*Easily Create Origami with Curved Folds and Surfaces* Origami—making shapes only through folding—reveals a fascinating area of geometry woven with a variety of representations. The world of origami has progressed dramatically since the advent of computer programs to perform the necessary computations for origami design. *3D Origami Art* presents the design methods underlying 3D creations derived from computation. It includes numerous photos and design drawings called crease patterns, which are available for download on the author's website. Through the book's clear figures and descriptions, readers can easily create geometric 3D structures out of a set of lines and curves drawn on a 2D plane. The author uses various shapes of sheets such as rectangles and regular polygons, instead of square paper, to create the origami. Many of the origami creations have a 3D structure composed of curved surfaces, and some of them have complicated forms. However, the background theory underlying all the creations is very simple. The author shows how different origami forms are designed from a common theory.

Perché sono state scelte proprio queste opere d'arte come soggetto della prima monografia? Realizzati nel 2018, i due meravigliosi dipinti, così come l'installazione Kupa Kupa di Kulata Tjuta, testimoniano come il processo di produzione dell'arte aborigena avvenga su base collaborativa. Queste opere, in cui convergono diversi miti del Tempo del Sogno, tipici della regione, rappresentano la

colonna portante della collezione al centro della Fondation Opale. La Fondation Opale, insieme alla sua fondatrice nonché forza trainante Bérengère Primat, ha un rapporto particolarmente intenso e attivo con i centri artistici e gli artisti di quella zona dell'Australia. Gli svariati viaggi nei territori APY (Australia Centrale) ne sono la prova. Entrambe le tele, cui hanno collaborato rispettivamente donne e uomini anziani, sono state commissionate da Bérengère Primat e il loro processo di realizzazione è abbondantemente documentato. Questi magistrali dipinti sono la testimonianza del continuum di cultura e profonda conoscenza di una terra attraverso la sua arte. Kupi Kupi, un'emanazione del progetto Kulata Tjuta (trad. "molte lance" in lingua Pitjantjatjara), avviato nel 2010 e tuttora in corso, è un'installazione monumentale di arte contemporanea formata da 1500 lance, una metafora della società Anangu contemporanea e della direzione imprevedibile in cui si sta muovendo. Tutte queste opere dimostrano il rinnovato interesse per l'arte aborigena nell'epoca contemporanea.

COLOUR=REALITY. B+W=ABSTRACTION (except zebras) developed by Hans Ulrich Obrist, artistic director of the Serpentine Gallery in London, and Agata Boetti, director of the Alighiero Boetti Archives, and is on show at the Fondazione Cini in Venice, in conjunction with 'Alighiero Boetti: Minimum/Maximum' an exhibition curated by Luca Massimo Barbero.0The project explores Boetti's strongly dialectic thought process as it revolves around the theme of photocopies.0The volume contains extensive written material, including an introductory essay by Obrist, another by Agata Boetti, a long, previously unpublished conversation between Agata Boetti and Obrist and two critical analyses by Michelle Cotton and Mario Garcia Torres respectively.0The publication also includes the complete reproduction of 111 photocopied images originally bound in an elegant volume with a red cloth cover. 0This work combines candid photographs of certain moments of Alighiero's private life and, at the same time, images of contemporary life and events recovered from newspapers and magazines; it represents a universal selection through its widespread appeal to all sections of the public.

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
