Liberal candidates, scholars, and activists mainly promote pragmatism rather than large and powerful narratives - which may be called 'alpha stories' for their commanding presence over time. Alternatively, conservative counterparts to such liberals tend to promote their policy preferences in alpha stories praising effective markets, excellent traditions, and limited government. In this face-off, liberals represent a post-Enlightenment world where many modern people, following Max Weber, are 'disenchanted', while many conservatives, echoing Edmund Burke, cherish stories borrowed from the past. Politics without Stories describes this storytelling gap as an electoral disadvantage for liberals because their campaigning lacks, and will continue to lack, the inspiration and shared commitments that great, long-term stories can provide. Therefore, Ricci argues that, for tactical purposes, liberals should concede their post-Enlightenment skepticism and rally around short-term stories designed to frame, in political campaigns, immediate situations which they regard as intolerable. These may help liberals win elections and influence the course of modern life.

In a century of mass atrocities, the Khmer Rouge regime marked Cambodia with one of the most extreme genocidal instances in human history. What emerged in the aftermath of the regime's collapse in 1979 was a nation fractured by death and dispersal. It is estimated nearly one-fourth of the country's population perished from hard labor, disease, starvation, and executions. Another half million fled their ancestral homeland, with over one hundred thousand people finding refuge in America. *From The Land of Shadows* surveys the Cambodian diaspora and the struggle to understand and make meaning of this historical trauma. Drawing on over 250 interviews with survivors across the United States as well as in France and Cambodia, Khatharya Um places these accounts in conversation with studies of comparative revolutions, totalitarianism, transnationalism, and

memory works to illuminate the pathology of power as well as the impact of auto-genocide on individual and collective healing. Exploring the interstices of home and exile, forgetting and remembering, *From the Land of Shadows* follows the ways in which Cambodian individuals and communities seek to rebuild connections frayed by time, distance, and politics in the face of this injurious history.

Pushed to the historical and social margins for too long, *Eastern Métis* reviews the record of these sidelined communities and the effort to reclaim their past. This book is the first-ever scholarly endeavor to trace the emergence and consolidation of Métis identities from the Atlantic Coast to Ontario and beyond.

Geoffrey Nash places David Urquhart's passionate belief in the ideal of municipal government in Turkey, W.S. Blunt's enthusiasm for the Egyptian reformers of the Azhar, E.G. Browne's zeal for

the Persian revolution and Marmaduke Pickthall's pained advocacy of the cause of the Young Turks into their political and historical context and into the context of their writings. The author argues that the actions of these men represented a distinctive identification with the Islamic world and of the involvement of the West in its politics. By condemning Britain's manoeuvres and choice of allies in the Near East, each of these writers embellished a narrative of betrayal and a breach with the British educated classes' view of the Islamic East. Through the lives and writings of these men who identified so passionately with the Islamic world, Nash offers a fascinating perspective on Britain's late imperial period.

This account of Pakistan's complicated political mosaic focuses on ethnic tensions within the country, the Mohajir movement, Pashtun and Baloch nationalisms, and the "Punjabization" of the country. Contributors also look at the country's complex position within the South Asian region, including its foreign policy, and the dialectic between domestic and foreign policy, and the role of the army. The book raises many thought-provoking questions, including the definition of Palestinian identity, the control of the state, and the deeply flawed institution of democracy.

Buku Sisi Lain Gerakan Sarekat Islam di Sulawesi Utara Periode 1920-1950 penulis fokuskan kajiannya pada daerah Bolaang Mongondow yang sejak tahun 1920-an menjadi salah satu daerah basis pergerakan organisasi Sarekat Islam. Bolaang Mongondow dikenal sebagai satu-satunya daerah di Sulawesi Utara yang sejak kedatangan Sarekat Islam, mayoritas penduduknya beragama Islam hingga sekarang ini. Itulah salah satu sebab organisasi Sarekat Islam dapat dengan mudah diterima dan berkembang dengan pesat di Bolaang Mongondow, dibandingkan dengan daerah-daerah

lain di Sulawesi Utara. Paling tidak, ada beberapa alasan mengapa buku ini penting ditulis. Pertama, Sarekat Islam adalah organisasi nasional pertama yang masuk ke Bolaang Mongondow, Sulawesi Utara. Kedua, Sarekat Islam adalah organisasi pertama di Bolaang Mongondow yang peduli akan pendidikan masyarakat pribumi, terutama masyarakat Muslim kelas bawah yang sama sekali tidak mendapatkan akses untuk mengenyam pendidikan di sekolah pemerintah kolonial Belanda sebagai akibat dari adanya perbedaan dalam hal mendapatkan pendidikan antara anak pribumi dan anak Eropa. Dari sinilah, sejak tahun 1923, Sarekat Islam berusaha untuk mendirikan sekolah-sekolah bagi masyarakat pribumi lewat Balai Pendidikan dan Pengajaran Islamiah (BPPI). Melalui sekolah Sarekat Islam, tidak sedikit para alumninya yang menjadi elit terdidik Bolaang Mongondow di kemudian hari. Ketiga, sejak awal Sarekat Islam fokus dan semangat untuk membangkitkan kekuatan ekonomi umat Muslim melalui berbagai bentuk kegiatan, baik dalam usaha penyadaran akan pentingnya umat Islam menguasai ekonomi dan kewirausahaan serta membangun jaringan usaha di antara masyarakat Muslim pribumi. Gerakan Sarekat Islam dalam bidang ekonomi ketika itu, tidak bisa dipandang sebelah mata. Khusus di Bolaang Mongondow, hampir di semua desa telah dibuka koperasi-koperasi Sarekat Islam yang dikenal

dengan Koperasi Khazanatullah. Suksesnya Koperasi Khazanatullah ketika itu menjadi kekuatan besar bagi Sarekat Islam dalam menjalankan dan menunjang misi politik, pendidikan dan kegiatan-kegiatan umat Islam lainnya, utamanya sebagai penguat organisasi di tengah politik Belanda. Sehingga dengan kesuksesan itu, diharapkan dapat menjadi motivasi besar dan spirit bagi Sarekat Islam di masa sekarang untuk membangun kembali gerakan ekonomi sebagaimana yang dilakukan para tokoh Sarekat Islam ketika itu. Dengan demikian, tidak dapat dipungkiri bahwa banyak tokoh yang lahir dari Sarekat Islam, utamanya tokoh-tokoh lokal Bolaang Mongondow sebagaimana penulis sebutkan di dalam buku ini. Tidak sedikit juga pemikiran mereka diberikan demi kemajuan Bolaang Mongondow, dan Indonesia pada umumnya. Tetapi berdasarkan penelusuran penulis, sangat jarang nama-nama mereka disebutkan dalam literatur-literatur yang tersedia, apalagi di era sekarang ini. Sehingga salah satu bagian penting dari buku ini adalah bisa menghadirkan tokoh-tokoh lokal Bolaang Mongondow yang sebenarnya jarang ditemukan di buku-buku sejarah yang ada. Tujuannya adalah agar para generasi sekarang bisa mengetahui lewat buku ini para tokoh Bolaang Mongondow yang pernah berjuang dalam rangka memerdekakan Indonesia, khususnya daerah Bolaang Mongondow.
