Part V—Electromagnetic Energy Modalities includes chapters on both the diathermies and low-level laser therapy. Part VI—Mechanical Energy Modalities includes chapters on traction, intermittent compression and therapeutic massage. Each chapter in Parts II-IV discuss: the physiologic basis for use, clinical applications, specific techniques of application through the use of related laboratory activities, and relevant individual case studies for each therapeutic modality.
