Under Ohio law, three state agencies are responsible for regulating various aspects of the program: the State Medical Board, the State Board of Pharmacy, and the Department of Commerce.

In the context of the growing opioid problem, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) launched an Opioids Action Plan in early 2016. As part of this plan, the FDA asked the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine to convene a committee to update the state of the science on pain research, care, and education and to identify actions the FDA and others can take to respond to the opioid epidemic, with a particular focus on informing FDA's development of a formal method for incorporating individual and societal considerations into its risk-benefit framework for opioid approval and monitoring.

The Department of Commerce (The Department) was assigned the responsibility of licensing, administering, monitoring, and the development and enforcement of rules for marijuana cultivators, testing laboratories, and processors. Additionally, the Department is responsible for implementing an electronic database for compliance monitoring and production control from seed to sale in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code. The Auditor of State's review found numerous instances of errors and inconsistencies in the evaluation and scoring of applicants and examples of the Department acting in violation of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). Most notably, the OAC 3796: 2-1-01 limits the number of provisional cultivator licenses that could be awarded before Sept. 8, 2018 to 12 per cultivator type for both Level I and Level II cultivators. The Department issued an additional Level I and an additional Level II provisional license in excess of the established threshold in an attempt to resolve errors

made by the Department and its reviewers which resulted in an apparent violation of state law.
