Solitary Courage is the story of a mother's tough-love determination, her severely disabled daughter's astonishing triumphs, and a documentary record of the political battles, organizational conflicts, and human struggles that citizens with disabilities face and fight every day of their lives. Mona Winberg became a pioneer of independent living, and emerged a leading advocate for citizens with mental and physical disabilities. Her courageous causes erupted from her deep reservoir of compassion and concern. Her unflinching challenges to the status quo expressed both optimism and realism about life and society. Her life is testament to the power of Solitary Courage. Between 1986 and 1999 she was the only newspaper columnist in North America regularly writing about disability issues. Through her award-winning column "Disabled Today" in Toronto's Sunday Sun, Mona Winberg painstakingly built up a body of work of more than 600 articles chronicling front-line battles for equality. She was a realist, a wise person with a no-nonsense approach, kindly, but clear-eyed. Solitary Courage begins with the story of Mona Winberg's life, followed by a representative selection of 156 of her columns organized into 20 thematic chapters, the best of Mona in her own words. The last part of the book reflects upon Mona Winberg's legacy of lessons that still connect to programs and policies touching the lives of Canadians with disabilities today. The subjects are wide-ranging and engaging because Mona used personal examples of individuals with disabilities and news-making issues raised by their plight. She also reported on the street-level outcomes of government policies. This variety and approach to disability issues provides real education and genuine human interest, whatever a reader's background or experience.

Academic Paper from the year 2016 in the subject Economy - Environment economics, grade: 1,0, University of Paderborn, language: English, abstract: After a short review of traditional welfare evaluation of climate change the paper turns its focus especially on uncertainty and reviews in this context the appropriateness of commonly used economic models for advising climate policy. Climate policy with regard to welfare optimization needs to focus on long-term development in the context of a sustainable future. Two prominent debates have been raised and sharply discussed. First, the long-term view has been highlighted by the appearance of the Stern review, which triggered a lively discussion on an adequate discount rate in the last decade. Second, the probability of the occurrence of severe disasters has been stressed. These considerations are mainly based on fat tails of a probability distribution, an issue initially raised by Weitzman. Based on structural uncertainties of input factors like climate sensitivity, society might experience an infinite high loss for low likelihood catastrophic disasters. His assumptions have been carefully scrutinized and revised in literature, which additionally provoked the question of applicability of traditional economic models. In addition, raising concerns are the potential tipping points that may lead to unpredictable impacts. A stringent policy has been suggested which can be mitigated over time while learning more about uncertainties through investigations.

Usually, however, the tone is urbane, the artistic aim to instruct through delight. Kipling knew that the maker of speeches and the poet were subject to the same law: "Unless they please they are not heard at all." "A Second Book of Words adds another forty-eight speeches to the thirty-eight that Kipling chose to make public, printing all the known uncollected speeches - long or short, carefully meditated or spontaneous, tendentious or diplomatic. Another twenty-five for which no text has so far been found are identified, as are the speeches that he is known to have written for members of the royal family."
