

Parlare Scrivere Comunicare Meglio Varia Demetra

Professionista straordinario, da corrispondente per il «Corriere della Sera» Luigi Barzini ha raccontato i principali eventi del suo tempo: il volo dei fratelli Wright, il raid Pechino-Parigi del 1907, la rivolta dei Boxer in Cina, il fronte libico, la guerra civile in Messico. Antieroe per cultura, egli rappresenta anche, nei suoi pregi e difetti, la media borghesia italiana che al crollo dello Stato liberale si consegna al fascismo e fiancheggia la dittatura. La sua storia attraversa l'esperienza di Salò e l'immediato dopoguerra, restituendoci uno spaccato dell'Italia, prima liberale e poi fascista. In queste pagine a metà tra il saggio e il romanzo, Simona Colarizi ricostruisce gli ultimi tre giorni di vita di Barzini prima della tragica fine, tutt'oggi avvolta dal mistero. Non semplicemente le vicende del cronista, ma anche dell'uomo nei suoi affetti privati: l'amore per la moglie e i figli, il senso di colpa per la fine del terzogenito, morto a Mauthausen. Al grande innovatore del giornalismo italiano fa da contraltare un uomo paradossalmente fragile, insicuro, tanto da incarnare secondo l'autrice «il prototipo del conformista moraviano». Il controverso rapporto con le élite, la fascinazione per il potere, la cocente delusione nei confronti della politica sono tratti che possono dirci molto sulla nostra identità di oggi. «La storia si ripete – scrive Colarizi – anche se non è mai identica a se stessa; in ogni tempo rotture più o meno traumatiche nei sistemi politici nascono dal malessere di una parte della popolazione che si sente esclusa dalla cittadinanza o percepisce quanto siano inadeguate le classi dirigenti a rappresentare le rivendicazioni e a soddisfare le aspettative dei cittadini».

Dagon H. P. Lovecraft - "Dagon" is a short story by American author H. P. Lovecraft. It was written in July 1917 and is one of the first stories that Lovecraft wrote as an adult. It was first published in the November 1919 edition of The Vagrant. Dagon was later published in Weird Tales. It is considered by many to be one of Lovecraft's most forward-looking stories. The story is the testament of a tortured, morphine-addicted man who relates an incident that occurred during his service as an officer during World War I. In the unnamed narrator's account, his cargo ship is captured by an Imperial German sea-raider in "one of the most open and least frequented parts of the broad Pacific". He escapes on a lifeboat and drifts aimlessly, south of the equator, until he eventually finds himself stranded on "a slimy expanse of hellish black mire which extended about [him] in monotonous undulations as far as [he] could see.... The region was putrid with the carcasses of decaying fish and less describable things which [he] saw protruding from the nasty mud of the unending plain." He theorizes that this area was formerly a portion of the ocean floor thrown to the surface by volcanic activity, "exposing regions which for innumerable millions of years had lain hidden under unfathomable watery depths.
