Bahréin es un reino del tamaño de Menorca en pleno golfo Pérsico, entre Arabia Saudí e Irán, sometido a muchas de las tensiones sectarias y políticas que agitan Oriente Medio. Un país de mayoría chií pero gobernado por una monarquía absolutista suní, antigua colonia británica, sede de la Quinta Flota americana, pionero en el descubrimiento de pozos petrolíferos y en la lucha obrera del mundo árabe, y el primer país musulmán en despenalizar la homosexualidad; un país cuya historia reciente se ha visto marcada por la salvaje represión que siguió a la revolución de 2011, que Sánchez Mediavilla reconstruye haciendo escala en Londres y Berlín para entrevistarse con miembros de la disidencia. Este es el retrato de una sociedad que combina la tolerancia religiosa más avanzada del Golfo con venas subterráneas de rigorismo wahabí y chií; que constituye un destino amable para los expatriados occidentales pero un infierno para los trabajadores asiáticos, sometidos a una cruel explotación laboral. When Isabel, in an attempt to discover the truth behind her heritage, reenacts Anna's excursion to Egypt, the story of her great-grandparents unravels before her, revealing startling parallels for her own life. Combining the romance and intricate narrative of a nineteenth-century novel with a very modern sense of culture and politics—both sexual and international—Ahdaf Soueif has created a thoroughly seductive and mesmerizing tale.

At *The Lucky Hand* is an account of the different love stories that revolve around a very peculiar book: *My Legacy*, by Anastas Branica. At first glance, this is a book where there is no plot or characters, only descriptions. However, that is what makes it a self-sufficient space, a world that can only be inhabited by its readers, which Anastas has written in order to live, within the book, with his beloved. Through what Petrovic called "simultaneous reading", it is possible to coincide with other people in the same book, and not only that, but also to live beyond what is simply written. Within this experience of reading-while-reading, participants are able to access a meeting place that is outside of reality. How else can we describe what happens to us when we read with true conviction, when books become life, palpable, manifested, when books become part of our physiology, when love is incarnated in the reading that two strangers perform at the same time, hoping that time will be abolished by the mere fact of fixing their gaze on a page? In short, what the reader of this book will surely experience, along with all the other readers who coincide in the experience, will be a state of joyous stupefaction. Above all else, the book is a love letter to the power of literature.

war. Hotel Tito is an award-winning autobiographical novel of the Serbo-Croatian War. Author Ivana Bodrožić was born in the Croatian town of Vukovar, just across the Danube from Serbia. In the fall of 1991, Vukovar was besieged by the Yugoslav People's Army for eighty-seven days. When the army broke the siege, people came up out of the basements where they'd been sheltering from bombardment; women and children were allowed out of the besieged city, but the army bused 400 men from the hospital to a farm on the outskirts where soldiers and Serbian paramilitaries massacred them. Bodrožić's father was among those taken and murdered. In Hotel Tito, after fleeing the war zone their town has become, the mother and two children are housed along with other displaced persons at a former communist school in the village of Kumrovec (the birthplace of Josip Tito). For years they share a single room just large enough for their three beds, waiting to hear whether the narrator's father survived and when they'll be granted an apartment of their own. In the meantime life goes on for the teenage protagonist, first loves bloom and burn quickly, new friendships are acquired and lost, new truths emerge, and new emotions. But she never loses her shy, insightful voice, nor her self-deprecating sense of humor. Hotel Tito is a sensitive and forthright coming of age novel in a time of atrocity and loss.
