By doing so we shall have a better appreciation of the full import of those events which make up the history of the Church. Our LORD and SAVIOR Jesus Christ is God our CREATOR and the CREATOR of the universe, there is no other [Isaiah 43:10]. Scriptures, the words of God [2 Timothy 3:16] in the Holy Bible instruct that Our LORD and SAVIOR Jesus Christ is God, our CREATOR and the CREATOR of the universe, the only true God [1 John 5:20], there is no other. There is only one God, as it is written in the Holy Bible: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one [Deuteronomy 6:4]. "before me no god was formed, nor shall there be any after me [Isaiah 43:10]. Our LORD and SAVIOR Jesus Christ instructs us that there is only one God: "I and the Father are one" [John 10:30].
