The question and answer sections of this manual are limited to material pertaining to "American Institute of Parliamentarians Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure" and "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised," 11th edition. The appendix provides a study based on the question section of "Parliamentary Law." If you are using this manual as a study guide in preparation for certification be aware that additional parliamentary authorities will also be included in any AIP certification examination at either the Certified Parliamentarian or Certified Professional Parliamentarian level. You should become familiar with other materials and the charts included in both authorities. Keep in mind that the references included in the materials are only a few of the many references that pertain to the questions asked and should be used as a starting point for further study.

This version is all you need to run your assembly. The "Newly Revised 11th Edition" of Robert's Rules of Order has no place in any assembly. It was conceived cynically to maintain the copyrights of these rules in the Robert family, and as such is almost unusable. This book has all the rules you need (in one-fifth the space of the 11th Ed. Newly Revised [130 pages rather than 700]), and Part II of this book is an effective primer for those new to parliamentary procedure (which is entirely lacking in the 11th Ed. Newly Revised). However, the editor suggests that this book be purchased along with its companion book, the Official Robert's Rules of Order Rulebook, which has reorganized the rules in rule format, and is designed specifically for adoption by an assembly as its official parliamentary rules of procedure. A parliamentarian will find the two books work well together. The present book contains fuller explanations of the rules in the Rulebook, and is also of historical interest for parliamentary scholars. The Rulebook is extensively cross-referenced with both this book and the 11th Ed. Newly Revised for more expansive scholarship on these rules.

In the face of the China challenge, the United States must secure freedom. China is a challenge because of its conduct. Modeled on 20th-century Marxist-Leninist dictatorship, the CCP eventually spurred rapid modernization and produced prodigious economic growth - thanks in no small measure to the party's decision in the late 1970s to embrace free-market elements and to the decision by the United States and nations around the world to engage, and welcome commerce with, China. The party today wields its economic power to co-opt and coerce countries around the world; make the societies and politics of foreign nations more accommodating to CCP specifications; and reshape international organizations in line with China's brand of socialism. At the same time, the CCP is developing a world-class military to rival and eventually surpass the U.S. military. These actions enable the CCP to credibly pursue the quest - proceeding outward through the Indo-Pacific region and encompassing the globe - to achieve "national rejuvenation" culminating in the transformation of the international order. To understand China's peculiar form of authoritarianism and the hegemonic goals to which it gives rise, it is necessary to grasp the intellectual sources from which China's conduct springs: the CCP's Marxist-Leninist beliefs and the party's extreme interpretation of Chinese nationalism.
