Paul McCartney and John Lennon described him as the Beatles' "favorite group," he won Grammy awards, wrote and recorded hit songs, and yet no figure in popular music is as much of a paradox, or as underrated, as Harry Nilsson. He won two Grammy awards, in 1969 for "Everybody's Talkin'" (the theme song for Midnight Cowboy), and in 1972 for "Without You," had two top ten singles, numerous album successes, and wrote a number of songs--"Coconut" and "Jump into the Fire," to name just two--that still sound remarkably fresh and original today. He was once described by his producer Richard Perry as "the finest white male singer on the planet," but near the end of his life, Nilsson's career was marked by voice-damaging substance abuse and the infamous deaths of both Keith Moon and Mama Cass in his London flat. A Comprehensive music appreciation method

Georg Kopprasch was born sometime before 1800, pursued a career as a horn player at least until 1832, and composed two sets of horn etudes which includes this set of 60 etudes, Op. 6. Most of the etudes focus on technical problems relating to the high range of the Horn.

Material contained in this book will not only enable trombonists to acquaint them with the basic functions of reading the alto, tenor and bass clefs, but will also afford the opportunity to practice: Legato slurring, mixed meters, odd meters, sequential exercises, scale and arpeggio patterns, F attachment exercises. The realization of a true legato style is one of the trombonist's most cherished dreams; to further the student's progress in developing such a legato technique, the editor has cast many of the exercises formerly set in a straight forte tonguing style into an expressive legato setting. Thus, while the student is mastering the problems of changing clefs he/she may also be applying the soft tongue (dah) legato approach to the musical examples contained herein.

The objective of this graduate trombone recital is to enhance and to gain a higher level of efficiency of the trombone's performance abilities and to learn the process of organizing a trombone recital. The pieces in this recital were chosen to show the ability of a professional trombonist using various techniques, expressions, styles and tone colors.
