

The Parrotlet Handbook

Wild birds are counted for a wide variety of reasons and by a bewildering array of methods. However, detailed descriptions of the techniques used and the rationale adopted are scattered in the literature, and the newcomer to bird census work or the experienced bird counter in search of a wider view, may well have difficulty in coming to grips with the subject as a whole. The Umbrella parrot is principally a pure white, medium-sized bird. Its body covering is totally white apart from a definite yellow coloration on the under-wings and at the

bottom of the tail. they're the sole massive parrot species with a completely white crest. Their crest is often flat on their head. it's raised with alarm, which can embody excitement, curiosity and/or worry. They have a rounded, umbrella-shaped crest once raised, therefore giving them their name. The beak is grayish-black, and like all parrots, is large, incurved and really powerful.
