Le attuali dinamiche dei consumi, in generale, e la diffusione dello stile “bio”, in particolare, dimostrano che il mercato complessivo alimentare stia evolvendo, caratterizzandosi sempre più di connotazioni legate agli stili di vita ed al benessere. Ciò, negli ultimi anni, ha generato profondi cambiamenti nelle abitudini e negli orientamenti alimentari in ragione proprio dell'affermazione di stili di consumo a forte connotazione emozionale e salutistica. Tale scenario ha stimolato, dunque, un interesse ad indagare gli aspetti differenziali delle abitudini di consumo alimentare, focalizzando l'attenzione sulle determinati e sulle dimensioni dei diversi segmenti del mercato biologico, con particolare riferimento al contesto italiano. Inoltre, a margine dell'analisi condotta, è stata sviluppata una sezione dedicata alle implicazioni di marketing, ovvero a rilevare alcune implicazioni di carattere di strategico-operative, in particolare sugli aspetti identitari, culturali e di comunicazione. Su tale impostazione di fondo, si focalizza il presente lavoro, la cui finalità riguarda l'analisi delle nuove dimensioni e stili alimentari che caratterizzano i consumatori di cibo biologico. Il lavoro muove, dunque, dalla necessità di interpretare cluster di consumatori differenziali attraverso un'indagine campionaria. La ricerca, pur non ambendo a rappresentatività statistica, rappresenta, comunque, un approfondimento sulla tipologia e sul comportamento dei consumatori di alimenti biologici.

Peter Eisenman is one of the most controversial protagonists of the architectural scene, who is known as much for his theoretical essays as he is for his architecture. While much has been written about his built works and his philosophies, most books focus on one or the other aspect. By structuring this volume around the concept of form, Stefano Corbo links together Eisenman's architecture with his theory. From Formalism to Weak Form: The Architecture and Philosophy of Peter Eisenman argues that form is the sphere of mediation between our body, our inner world and the exterior world and, as such, it enables connections to be made between philosophy and architecture. From the start of his career on, Eisenman has been deeply interested in the problem of form in architecture and has constantly challenged the classical concept of it. For him,

form is not simply a cognitive tool that determines a physical structure, which discriminates all that is active from what is passive, what is inside from what is outside. He has always tried to connect his own work with the cultural manifestations of the time: firstly under the influence of Colin Rowe and his formalist studies; secondly, by re-interpreting Chomsky's linguistic theories; in the 80's, by collaborating with Derrida and his de-constructivist approach; more recently, by discovering Henri Bergson's idea of Time. These different moments underline different phases, different projects, different programmatic manifestos; and above all, an evolving notion of form. Taking a multi-disciplinary approach based on the intersections between architecture and philosophy, this book investigates all these definitions and, in doing so, provides new insights into and a deeper understanding of the complexity of Eisenman's work.

After strong growth in 2017 and early 2018, global economic activity slowed notably in the second half of last year, reflecting a confluence of factors affecting major economies. China's growth declined following a combination of needed regulatory tightening to rein in shadow banking and an increase in trade tensions with the United States. The euro area economy lost more momentum than expected as consumer and business confidence weakened and car production in Germany was disrupted by the introduction of new emission standards; investment dropped in Italy as sovereign spreads widened; and external demand, especially from emerging Asia, softened. Elsewhere, natural disasters hurt activity in Japan. Trade tensions increasingly took a toll on business confidence and, so, financial market sentiment worsened, with financial conditions tightening for vulnerable emerging markets in the spring of 2018 and then in advanced economies later in the year, weighing on global demand. Conditions have eased in 2019 as the US Federal Reserve signaled a more accommodative monetary policy stance and markets became more optimistic about a US–China trade deal, but they remain slightly more restrictive than in the fall.

This highly original work examines the rise of the urban food planning movement in the Global North and provides insights into the new relationship between cities and food which has started developing over the past decade. It sheds light on cities as new spaces for food system innovation and on food as a tool for sustainable urban development. Drawing insights from the literature on socio-technical transitions, the book presents examples of pioneering urban food planning endeavours from North America and Western Europe (especially the Netherlands and the UK). These are integrated into a single mosaic helping to uncover the conceptual, analytical, design, and organizational innovations emerging at the interface of food and urban policy and planning. The author shows how promising "seeds of transition" to a shared urban food planning agenda are in the making, though the urban food planning niche as a whole still lacks the necessary maturity to lastingly influence mainstream planning practices and the dominant agri-food system regime. Some of the strategic levers to cope with the current instability and limitations of urban food planning and effectively transition it from a marginal novelty to a normalized domain of policy, research, and practice are systematically examined to this end. The conclusions and recommendations put forward have major implications for scholars, activists, and public officials seeking to radically transform the co-evolution of food, cities, and the environment.
