Gender Mainstreaming gilt als politische Querschnittsaufgabe die einer Ungleichbehandlung der Geschlechter auf der politischen Handlungsebene und innerhalb von Institutionen und Organisationen entgegenwirken und auf vorhandene Defizite hinweisen soll. Ungleichbehandlungen geschehen nicht allein aufgrund der Kategorie Geschlecht, sondern auch aufgrund der Schichtzugehörigkeit und der Ethnizität eines Menschen. Als Analyseansatz von Mehrfachdiskriminierungen kann die Intersektionalitätstheorie herangezogen werden. Der vorliegende Forschungsgegenstand der zuvor genannten theoretischen Ansätze ist das Handlungsfeld der Kommunalpolitik. Hierbei stehen die Stadt Bochum und der Ausschuss für Migration und Integration der Stadt und dessen Mitglieder im Mittelpunkt der Forschung. Als zentrales Ergebnis der vorliegenden Forschungsarbeit lässt sich eine primäre Fokussierung auf migrations- und integrationspolitische Themen innerhalb der inhaltlichen Arbeit des Ausschusses festhalten. Gleichstellungs- und geschlechtspolitische Themen werden laut der Aussage der befragten Ausschussmitglieder in der Arbeit des Ausschusses mitbeachtet. Die Umsetzung der gleichstellungs- und geschlechtspolitischen Themen zeigt sich problematisch und wird folglich kritisch diskutiert. Gleichwohl ist den befragten Ausschussmitgliedern die inhaltliche Bedeutung des Begriffes „Gender Mainstreaming“ nicht bekannt. Die Umsetzung des Gender Mainstreaming rückt in den Hintergrund der Politik. Konkrete Handlungsempfehlungen sollen dazu dienen, die bereits angestoßenen Maßnahmen zur Umsetzung gleichstellungs- und geschlechtspolitischer Themen voranzutreiben.

An illustrated exploration of colors and patterns in the animal kingdom, what they communicate, and how they function in the social life of animals. Are animals able to appreciate what humans refer to as "beauty"? The term scarcely ever appears nowadays in a scientific description of living things, but we humans may nonetheless find the colors, patterns, and songs of animals to be beautiful in apparently the same way that we see beauty in works of art. In *Animal Beauty*, Nobel Prize-winning biologist Christiane Nüsslein-Volhard describes how the colors and patterns displayed by animals arise, what they communicate, and how they function in the social life of animals. Watercolor drawings illustrate these amazing instances of animal beauty. Darwin addressed the topic of ornament in his 1871 book *The Descent of Man and Selection in Relation to Sex*, and did not hesitate to engage with criteria of beauty, convinced that animals experienced color and ornament as attractive and agreeable in the same way that we do, and that the role this played in mate choice pointed to a "sexual selection" distinct from natural selection. Nüsslein-Volhard examines key examples of ornament and sexual selection in the animal kingdom and lays the groundwork for biological aesthetics. Noting that color patterns have not been a research priority—perhaps because they appeared to be nonessential luxuries rather than functional necessities—Nüsslein-Volhard looks at recent scientific developments on the topic. In part because of Nüsslein-Volhard's own research on the zebrafish, it is now possible to decipher the molecular genetic mechanisms that lead to production of colors in animal skin and its appendages and control its pattern and distribution.

This book deals with the new concept of biodiversity offsets. The aim of offsetting schemes is to achieve no net loss or even net gain of biodiversity. Offsets obey a mitigation hierarchy and reflect the precautionary and polluter-pays principle in regard to project impacts. Readers gain insights into current debates on biodiversity policies, with top experts outlining theoretical principles and the latest research findings. At the same time the focus is on practical application and case studies. A further aim of the book is to offer grounded insights on the road ahead, and foster a more intensive and fruitful discussion on how offsetting can be extended and improved upon, so that it becomes a key and effective component of Europe's biodiversity conservation policy framework.

The book concludes that the authors of these stories were themselves struggling with ambivalence about women in their own worlds and that this struggle manifested itself in their writings.

The state can be reduced neither to an apparatus of power in the service of dominant groups nor to a neutral site where conflicting interests are played out: rather, it constitutes the form of collective belief that structures the whole of social life. The 'collective fiction' of the state is a fiction with very real effects - is at the same time the product of all struggles between different interests, what is at stake in these struggles, and their very foundation. While the question of the state runs through the whole of Bourdieu's work, it was never the subject of a book designed to offer a unified theory. The lecture course presented here, to which Bourdieu devoted three years of his teaching at the Collège de France, fills this gap and provides the key that brings together the whole of his research in this field. This text also shows 'another Bourdieu', both more concrete and more pedagogic in that he presents his thinking in the process of its development. While revealing the illusions of 'state thought' designed to maintain belief in government being oriented in principle to the common good, he shows himself equally critical of an 'anti-institutional mood' that is all too ready to reduce the construction of the bureaucratic apparatus to the function of maintaining social order. At a time when financial crisis is facilitating the hasty dismantling of public services, with little regard for any notion of popular sovereignty, this book offers the critical instruments needed for a more lucid understanding of the wellsprings of domination.
