Three years later, Sayman jumped ship for Google. *App Kid* is the galvanizing story of a young Latino, not yet old enough to drink, who excelled in the cutthroat world of Silicon Valley and went on to become an inspiration to thousands of kids everywhere by following his own surprising, extraordinary path. In this candid and uplifting memoir, Sayman shares the highs and lows, the successes and failures, of his remarkable journey. There, he experienced a deep religious experience that altered his self-destructive path completely. God spoke to him in a personal and powerful way and he left the gang the very next day, even though such a rejection of his Crip brothers almost certainly meant death. Today, with Steve Skipper's message, his success, and his talent, he inspires millions. And now, with this book, his story and powerful testimony will reach even more who so desperately need to hear his message of determination, salvation, strength through Christ, and deliverance from the demons that hold them back.
